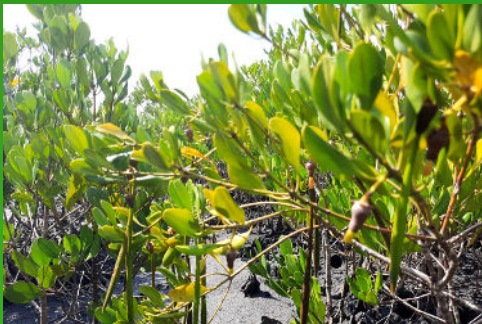


Since March 2020, the 49.32-hectare Amboanio 2 site in Madagascar's Betsiboka Estuary has grown 10,000 trees as part of 162,391 planted through community support to restore mangroves degraded by logging, overfishing, and pollution. The reforestation project has created 17,745 working days, providing income for the 3,000 nearby residents who rely on fishing and improving access to food, healthcare, education, and small business opportunities.

Since July 2021, the Irregele Milato site in Mozambique's Quelimane District has grown 493,858 trees, including 10,000 through community support. Located in a historically significant region once part of the Swahili trade network, the project restores mangroves to fight deforestation, erosion, and flooding while improving local livelihoods and access to basic services.
